



28 Cadets from RIMC qualify final UPSC NDA selections, setting a new Benchmark

DEHRADUN, 14 Apr: The Rashtriya Indian Military College, Dehradun, has once again made the nation proud as Cadet Emon Ghosh from West Bengal clinched All-India Rank 1 in the NDA-INA II 2024 Examination, conducted by the Union Public Service Commission. This outstanding result reaffirms RIMC's status as the premier institution for grooming future leaders of the Indian Armed Forces.

The feat is not only a personal triumph for Cadet Ghosh but also a reflection of the rigorous academic framework, disciplined lifestyle, and unwavering mentorship provided at RIMC. The College's commitment to holistic development—nurturing both intellect and character—continues to bear fruit. RIMC's excellence continues with four other cadets securing positions in



the top 20 nationwide and 10 in top 100. Kartik Pant – AIR 5; Brahma Swaroop Das – AIR 14; Shravan Agrawal – AIR 15; Aditya Raj – AIR 17.

In total, a record-breaking number of 28 cadets from RIMC made the final selections in UPSC—the highest from any single institution across the country.

The success is collectively attributed to the team effort led by Commandant Col Rahul Agarwal, (under aegis of Army Training Command) with emphasis on structured mentorship, character-building, military leadership and academic depth has created an environment where excellence becomes a habit.

An ably led team of faculty and mentors under PK Jain and Col Hari Bishu, has provided meticulous guidance in SSB preparations and career mentoring equipping the cadets to navigate the demanding selection process. Subject faculty also played an instrumental role, providing

strategic support for the UPSC syllabus.

RIMC student secures top rank in NDA entrance, 28 from institution clear exam

Dehradun: In a landmark achievement, 28 students from the Rashtriya Indian Military College (RIMC) in Dehradun successfully cleared the National Defence Academy/Naval Academy (I) 2025 examination, with one of the students securing the All India Rank 1.

Public relations officer (PRO) (defence), Dehradun, Lt Col Manish Shrivastava, said on Monday that the total number of RIMC students passing the NDA/NA test was the highest in the past 15 years of the institution.

"A total of 38 RIMC cadets appeared for the exam, and 28 cleared it. Emon Ghosh from West Bengal secured the first rank across the country, while four others – Kartik Pant from Uttarakhand (AIR 5),

Brahma Swaroop Das (AIR 14), Shravan Agrawal (AIR 15), and Aditya Raj (AIR 17) – also featured in the top 20 ranks," said Shrivastava.

Describing the feat as a 'collective success', he said, "It was the result of the specialised guidance by RIMC commandant Col Rahul Agarwal and the Army Training Command (ARTRAC). The institution's emphasis

on character development, military leadership, academic excellence, and holistic grooming has been crucial in this achievement."

Established in 1922 as the Prince of Wales Royal Indian Military College, RIMC was inaugurated by Prince Edward VIII and later rechristened following India's independence. Today, it operates as an Inter Service Category

'A' establishment, administered through ARTRAC under the aegis of the defence ministry. A feeder institution for the National Defence Academy, Indian Naval Academy, and subsequently the Indian Armed Forces, it provides public school education to young boys and girls between the ages 11 and 18, specially selected through an all India competitive examination.

Since its inception, the institution has produced a distinguished cadre of leaders in both military and civil spheres. Its alumni include four Chiefs of Army Staff and two Chiefs of Air Staff in India as well as senior military leaders in Pakistan. Beyond armed forces, graduates from RIMC also include high-ranking civil servants, governors, ambassadors and ministers among others.

देहरादून, 14 अप्रैल (नवोदय टाइम्स) : राष्ट्रीय इंडियन मिलिट्री कॉलेज (आरआईएमसी) के छात्र इमोन घोष ने एनडीए सेकंड 2024 परीक्षा में पूरे देश में पहली रैंक हासिल की है। संस्थान के चार अन्य केडेट भी टॉप 20 में जगह बनाने में कामयाब रहे हैं। इस उपलब्धि पर आरआईएमसी में जश्न का माहौल है।

राष्ट्रीय भारतीय सैनिक कॉलेज शुरू से ही एनडीए में बेहतरीन प्रदर्शन के लिए देश भर में अपनी अलग पहचान रखता है। रविवार को जारी हुए 2024 के एनडीए सेकंड के फाइनल रिजल्ट में संस्थान के कुल 28 केडेट्स ने अंतिम चयन सूची में जगह बनाई है। संस्थान का दावा है कि यह एक राष्ट्रीय



कीर्तिमान है। देश के किसी भी एक संस्थान से इतनी ज्यादा युवाओं का चयन एनडीए के लिए नहीं हुआ है। इसमें पहले स्थान पर पश्चिम बंगाल के केडेट इमोन घोष रहे हैं।

इनके अलावा कार्तिक पंत ने पांचवाँ रैंक, ब्रह्मस्वरूप दास ने 14^{वाँ} रैंक, श्रवण अग्रवाल ने 15^{वाँ} रैंक और आदित्य राज ने 17^{वाँ} रैंक हासिल की है। संस्थान के कमांडेंट कर्नल राहुल

अग्रवाल ने इस उपलब्धि पर सोमवार को सभी सफल युवाओं को बधाई दी और मिठाइयां बांटकर इस उपलब्धि का जश्न मनाया। उन्होंने बताया कि इमोन घोष शुरू से ही बहुत प्रतिभाशाली केडेट

रहे हैं और सभी गतिविधियों में वह आमतौर पर अव्वल आते रहे हैं।






ALL INDIA HUGH CATCHPOLE ENGLISH DEBATES

NAHAN HIKE


Adventure at its Peak


