INAUGURATION OF RENOVATED HERITAGE HOSTEL BUILDING

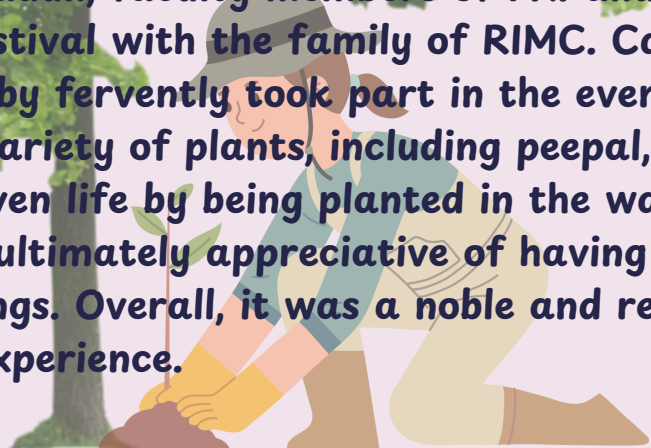

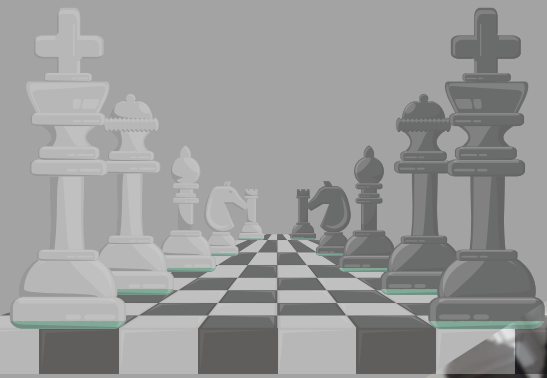

HOMAGE TO GEN SUNDARAJAN PADMANABHAN, PVSM, AVSM, VSM

FORMER CHIEF OF ARMY STAFF



General Padmanabhan, PVSM, AVSM, VSM, an iconic figure in military history, exhibited genius through sacrifice, leadership, and strategic decision-making. His deep impact continues to inspire, going beyond simple leadership to actually knowing and guiding the flag bearers of India. His demise on August 19, 2024, at the age of 83, brought an end to the legacy of a remarkable soldier whose unshakable loyalty would be remembered by the entire country.

Affectionately known as 'Paddy', General Padmanabhan was born in Kerala, an illustrious alumnus of Kitchener (now Shivaji) Section in RIMC between 1952-1956. This was followed by the National Defence Academy, Khadakwasla in Pune. His military journey began when he was commissioned into the Regiment of Artillery after graduating from IMA in 1959. He was a graduate of the Defence Services Staff College at Wellington in 1973 and the National Defence College at New Delhi. A visionary leader whose career was marked by a series of prestigious command and instructional postings, in sites like Gazala Mountains, School of Artillery, Ranchi (part of then Bihar) and Punjab from August 1975 to 1992.

After his promotion to Lieutenant General, he was the commander of the 15 Corps in the Kashmir Valley from 1993 to 1995. He held the appointment of Director General Military Intelligence after which he commanded the field armies as GOC-in-C of Northern and Southern Armies. In September 2000, he assumed the charge as the Chief of Army Staff, a position he held with distinction until his retirement in 2002, capping over 43 years of distinguished military service. Post-retirement, he pursued his literary interests, authoring three books that reflect his knowledge and wisdom.

We honour General Padmanabhan's services as well as the virtues he personified: honesty, strategic vision, and steadfast devotion to the country. His efforts will serve as a timeless model of what it means to serve with dignity and distinction, inspiring upcoming generations of leaders and military personnel.

By paying respect to General Padmanabhan, we celebrate his life of distinction and his legacy, which will always be an inspiration and source of pride for all who uphold the principles of patriotism, duty, and honour. Also, due to his immense contributions in serving our nation, we at RIMC proudly and humbly dedicate our college swimming pool, which will now be known as Padmanabhan Swimming Pool, in a hope to pay homage to his chauvinistic character that shall live forever.

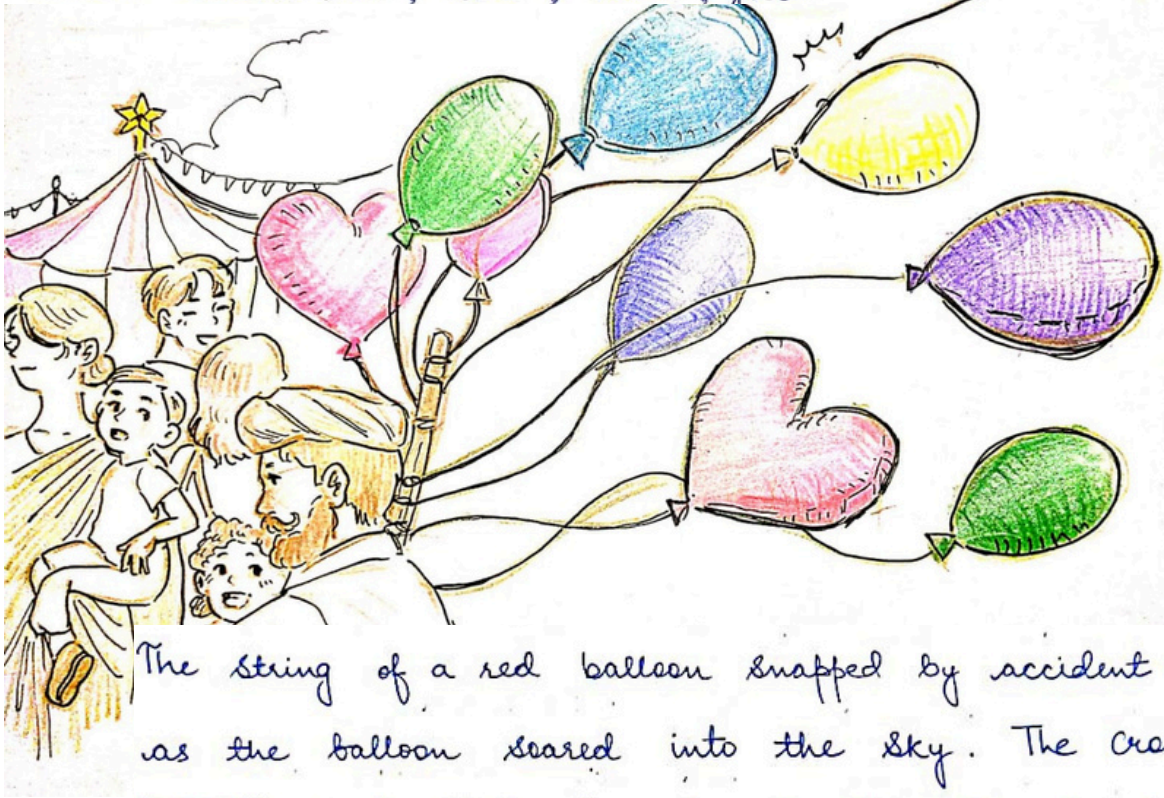
