




IPS HINDI ESSAY WRITING COMPETITION





Itself a home





"An admission into the NDA means more than a mere career to me-it means erasure from my mind of all those dark moments when I failed to see matters in their true perspective; when I fell short of the moral standards of a Rimcollian." These were the words spoken by the legend himself as he embarked on a journey of becoming a beacon of ground-breaking military stratergies.

General Sundararajan Padmanabhan, PVSM, AVSM, VSM- 56/Shivaji was born in Trivandrum, Kerela on 05 Dec 1940. Affectionately known as Paddy, he is an alumnus of the prestigious Rashtriya Indian Military College(RIMC), National Defence Academy(NDA) and Indian Military Academy(IMA).

His tenure in RIMC from 1952 to 1956 is an illustration of tenfolds of human psychology, starting from an young Rimco to a chevronné cadet of ideals and integrity by his V-A. He had always been a bright star in the Academic Block as well as in the fields of Rajwara Camp. In his class II-A remarks, Mr. Hugh Catchpole, then Principal said, "He has continued to make excellent progress in class and is now much less shy. He is well behaved and has a good sense of humour. I am pleased with his development."

They say, "One good anecdote is worth a volume of biography." But since we can't take liberty of writing an entire biography, we were able to drain out one of the surprisingly-odd anecdote about him. It was September 24th, 1955 when Gen Padmanabhan had appeared for the Services Selection Board and Medical Board. it is mentioned that he was spending the last few days, asking a few members of the Staff indirectly as to how he can get rejected as he didn't like to join Army. Mr Din Dayal, then Principal, warned him and told him to play fair

He has returned from Meerut after getting
through the Services Selection Board but getting permanently unfit before the Medical Board for the following
defects:

(a) Sub standard vision.
(b) Trachoma stage IIA.

(c) D.N.S. (L)
(d) Retrn. Tymp. Memb (both)
(e) Knock knee mild
(f) Old inj.Herniotomy (R) Scar.
(g) Slight overweight.

In this connection I am told that he couldn't read the
third line on the eye chart. We have nothing on his
medical history sheet to point to sub standard vision.

Once he reached home, Mr S Sundararajan, his father, made him revise his decision and made him re-appear for the medical examination. He successfully passed and then, there was no looking back.

Dear Mr. Sundararajan,

It has given me an immense pleasure to find that Padmanabhan kept his word and has been declared fit by the Medical Re-Board. I am proud of him and will be grateful if you will convey myhearty congratulations to him. I am sure that he has a bright future before here.


We all shall watch Padmanabhan's progress at N.D.A. with great interest. I'm sure that he will quit himself worthily in facing all future responsibilities.
