

## LEARNING BY VISITING

#### CLASS I, CLASS IVA & CLASS VA

IMA

The First Termers, Class IV A and Class VA, along with Mr Shishupal and Mr Karthik, visited the Indian Military Academy. They were welcomed at the Chetwode Building where the antiques of Indian, Chinese and Pakistan Armies are exhibited. Then they visited the Hoshiyar Singh Gymnasium and the Multi Purpose Hall. Cadets watched a Movie on IMA in the Kheterpal Auditorium. Finally, they went to the IMA Stables and the Somnath Sharma Mess.

#### CLASS IA

National Hydrographic Office [NHO]

The cadets of Class IA visited the National Hydrographic Office along with their OIC. Mr Selven. It is the only Institution in India that produces the maps of water bodies. The cadets were shown the process of making maps. These maps are printed in four colors which are blue, black, green and magenta, specifying neir depth. The Office makes ENCs [Electronic Navigation Charts] which are available on Internet. The cadets were also shown maps which are nearly 100 years old.

#### CLASS II

Survey of India

The cadets along with Mr PN Naik and Mrs T Khatoon, visited the Survey of India. At first they visited the Geodating Museum where they saw instruments like the Theodolite, Sun dials, Tide Gauge and India's oldest Clock. They were also given an insight into the mean sea level and were also explained about India's missions in Antarctica.

#### CLASS IIA

DEAL

The cadets of Class IIA visited DEAL (Defence Electronics Application Laboratory) along with Mr Pramod Sharma, Mrs Rekha Negi and Mr Balvir Singh Chauhan. There the cadets were shown a live telecast of a satellite and different types of Unmanned Air Vehicles like RUSTAM I, RUSTAM II. They visited the environmental chamber where the equipment is tested in various environmental situations.

#### CLASS III

Indian Institute of Petroleum

Class III, along with Mr UP Dalvi, Mr Sudhir and Sqn Ldr Vandana visited Indian Institute of Petroleum. There they witnessed some of the activities of making petroleum like Refining, Catalytic Refining, Separation Process, Solvent Extraction and petrochemical intermediates.

#### Class IIIA

Ramakrishna Mission

29 cadets of Class III A along with Mr Khushi Ram and Mr Birjesh Chauhan, visited the Ramakrishna Mission, On their arrival, they visited the temple of all the religions, where the idol of Ramakrishna along with the symbols of all the religions was placed. They visited the VIVEC [Vivekananda Value Education Centre] and also interacted with Swami Dhyanasthananda, Head of the Institution, who explained the core principles of Ramakrishna Mission. OPTO Electrical Factory

Amici Light Inversion Lens, LASER rods. These materials are also used in some of the equipment of Indian Armed Forces like the INSA 5.56 mm Lakshya Rifle, Ogra Grenade Launchers, T-90 Tanks, etc.





This fact has amply been proven as it has gone down in the pages of the opulent RIMC history, as Air Chief Marshal BS Dhanoa, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, VM, ADC, has been appointed the 25th Chief of Air Staff, the sixth Service Chief to have Passed Out from the revered portals of the College. Gen KS Thimayya, DSO, Padma Vibhushan, became the first Service Chief to be appointed in 1957. Gen Thimayya was the only Indian to command an Infantry Brigade in the Second World War and is regarded as the most distinguished Combat Officer of the Indian Army. He was also the Best All Round Cadet in his days at the College. Gen GG Bewoor, Padma Bhushan, PVSM, was

the next Service's Chief from the College who was appointed the Chief of Army staff in 1973. A veteran of the 1965 and 1971 Indo - Pak Wars, he was also a Cadet Captain during his tenure at the RIMC and was awarded the Lord Rawlinson's Trophy. Gen VN Sharma, PVSM, AVSM, ADC, another alumnus of the College, served as the Chief of Army Staff from 1988 to 1990. He is another war hero from the 1965 and 1971 Indo - Pak Wars. In 1991, Air Chief Marshal NC Suri, PVSM, AVSM, VM, ADC, became the first RIMCOLLIAN Chief of Air Staff in India. Gen S Padmanabhan, PVSM, AVSM, VSM was the fifth RIMCOLLIAN Chief of Services who took over at the helm of the Indian Army in 2000.

The anointing of the sixth Service Chief, an alumnus from the RIMC, goes a long way to prove the fact that we do not believe in sitting smugly over our past laurels but believe in renewing and reiterating our, pledge to this 'Cradle of Excellence'. The dawn of the year 2017 rang in good tidings as Air Chief Marshal BS Dhanoa, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, VM, ADC took over from the outgoing Air Chief Arup Raha, PVSM, AVSM, VM, ADC on 1 January.

Born into an illustrious family, the Air Chief

Marshal, BS Dhanoa's father, Mr Sarayan Singh was an IAS Officer and his grandfather Capt Sant Singh was a Captain of the British Indian Army. Air Chief Marshal BS Dhanoa was Commissioned into the fighter stream of the Indian Air Force in June 1978. He has flown fighter aircraft across the spectrum including HJT-16 Kiran, MiG-21, SEPECAT Jaguar, MiG-29 and Su-30MKI. He held several key operational and administrative appointments in his 37 years of career including Director Targeting Cell at Air Headquarters, Director Fighter Operations 8 War Planning at Headquarters Western Air Command, Assistant Chief of Air Staff (Intelligence) at Air Headquarters, Senior Air Staff Officer of Eastern & Western Air Command and Air Officer Commanding-in-Chief of South Western Air Command. He has held instructional appointments of Senior Air Instructor and Chief Air Instructor at Defence Services Staff College, Wellington and has led an Indian Air Force Training Team abroad.

He has been the Commanding Officer of a front line ground attack Fighter Squadron during the Kargil Conflict in 1999. Under his leadership, the Squadron devised innovative methods of night bombing at high altitudes which had never been attempted before. His Squadron was adjudged the Best Fighter Squadron of HQ WAC. He was awarded Yudh Seva Medal (YSM) and Vayu Sena Medal (VM) for his gallant actions in this conflict.

The Air Chief has been awarded with several other medals: the Param Vishisht Seva Medal in 2016, the Ati Vishisht Seva Medal in 2015. He was also appointed as Honorary ADC to the President of India on 1 August 2015.

The pages of the records documented in the folds of their Dossiers might have paled, but the lustre of their success stories and the trails they have blazed shall always be gleaming and be a guiding light for the young RIMCOs and RIMCOLLIANS. Unarguably, this esteemed Institution has been the cornerstone in transforming them to reach the zenith of success they have reached today.



'Adventure is about eliminating risks,' said Mr Navin Gulia, who is an internationally acclaimed author, adventurer, thinker, orator and social worker. This adventurous personality and recipient of numerous prestigious awards had recently come to the RIMC on 12 Feb 2017 and motivated the cadets with his exemplary life stories and motivational talk. An ex Army Officer, he is a World Record Holder in adventure sports.

However, luck wasn't always there by his side and fate had come down on him cruelly during his IMA days. Even though he was one of the best Gentleman Cadets of his time, yet, destiny had different plans for him. During an Obstacle Training Competition, he met with an accident which was nearly fatal. It was after that day, he started facing the real obstacles of life. Every day was a battle for him and 'giving up' was an option that he never gave to himself. After a few months of hospitalization, he recuperated, only to be confined to a wheelchair. He had been completely paralyzed for around two

years, during which he read books by suspending them above him as both his hands were rendered useless. His perception had changed as he viewed the entire incident from a different angle and thought life had given him a second chance. And thus, began the 'second innings' of his life which was even more vivacious and vibrant than the previous one

He is a World Record Holder in adventure driving and a Writer in three languages. Of the many awards won by him, some of them include the Chief of Army Staff Commendation in 2005, The Times of India 'Global Indian' 2005, The President's
'National Role Model' Award in 2007,
Limca book 'People of The Year' 2005,
Karmaveer Chakra in 2009, the Godfrey
Philips 'Mind of Steel' 2010, State Award
for Adventure Sports 2004, Cavinkare
Ability 'Mastery Award' 2006, Karmaveer
Puruskar 2011, CNN IBN 'Real Heroes'
Award in 2012, Indira Krantiveer Puruskar
2012, and 'Pearls of India' by 'The WEEK'
magazine.



We wish Sqn Ldr C Hari Kumar ALL THE BEST for a fruitful and successful tenure at the RIMC.





#### JUNGLE WARFARE









#### MILITARY HISTORY SEMINAR
