On their fourth day, Cadets Ayush and Afrid had their events which were Javelin Throw and 400m, respectively. Cadet Ayush threw the Javelin at a distance of 45.34m but the qualifying distance was 50m. Cadet Afrid gave a timing of 55.55 sec but missed the qualification by a fraction of a second. In the evening, they had tea with the Rimcollians and also met Rear Admiral Srinivas who gave them a pep talk to join Navy.



On the fifth day, Cadet Pratham Singh had his Finals. He again cleared a height of 170cm and stood 13<sup>th</sup> in the Finals. The National Junior Athletics Meet was closed and Lt Cdr Amit took them for lunch and then to Ramakrishnan Beach. The setting sun witnessed from the beach made a beautiful sight which was extremely rejuvenating.

On the sixth day they visited MARCOs Base at INS Karna. They were received by Rimcollian, Lt Cdr Vishal and they also got a chance to see the weapons and gadgets used by MARCOs. They also got an opportunity to shoot with MS-5 and returned on the 28<sup>th</sup> of November with a whole lot of experience and learning.

## CROWNING GLORY

Vice Admiral Bimal Verma, AVSM, ADC, Commander in Chief, Andaman & Nicobar Command (CINCAN), visited RIMC on 02 Feb 2018 and inaugurated the Sea Harrier. Rimcollian, Cmdr Rakesh Mishra, along with his seven member Team of Maintenance Crew did the amazing job of bringing the Sea Harrier all the way from Goa in 8 days. It arrived on the 25<sup>th</sup> of January in two mammoth carriers and later was assembled at the RIMC



with the help of a crane in just two days. This Aircraft was commissioned into the Indian Navy in 1983. It is a British Aircraft that uses Pegasus 104 Vector Thrust Turbofan Engine of 95.6 KN. A Subsonic Aircraft, it has a speed of over 737 MPH. It was extensively flown from Aircraft Carrier, INS Vikrant. The Inauguration Ceremony was

attended by top Officers of the Defence Forces. The Administrative Officer, Lt Col Vishal Singh received Admiral Bimal Verma and introduced him to the RIMC Faculty Members. Other

eminent Dignitaries who were present on the occasion were, Joint Chief Hydrographer, Rear Admiral Adhir Arora; Sub Area Commander, Maj Gen JS Yadav; Dy GOC Sub Area, Brig HS Jaggi and Col Arun Mangain, former Commandant of the RIMC. The CINCAN also addressed the Cadets, Faculty and visiting Dignitaries on this occasion. After addressing the gathering, he also awarded Commendation Cards to Sub Maj Jay Dhanraj and Hav Gurucharan Singh for their distinguished service to the RIMC.

They were fascinated to see the Chetwode Building, Hoshiyar Singh Gymnasium and the Somnath Stadium, named after the illustrious Rimcollian Major Somnath Sharma, India's first PVC recipient. They were also enthralled by the magnificent Picture Gallery at the FRI.

23 cadets of Class IA went to the National Hydrographic Centre, accompanied by their OIC, Mr Pramod Sharma. They were also told about how map information is sent from a ship.

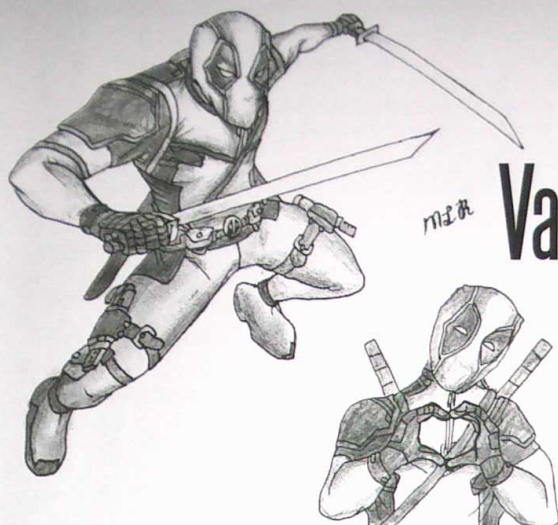

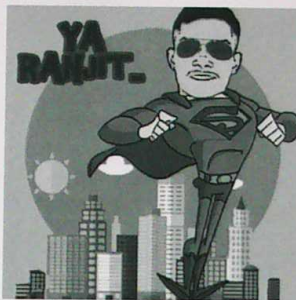
